# Gatemays Alumni -Henrietta Hill QC

Henrietta Hill attended Gateways from 1977 - 1991, successfully achieving A Levels in History, Latin and Classical Studies.

Henrietta studied law at Emmanuel College, Cambridge for 3 years, then took a year out, working for a legal aid solicitors firm in Leeds and travelling in South East Asia. She undertook post-graduate studies in human rights and criminal justice at Harvard University before being called to the Bar in 1997. Henrietta still practises as a barrister, specialising in equality/discrimination, human rights, police law and inquests/public inquiries.

## What did you enjoy most about going to Gateways?

The beautiful surroundings, the small group lessons with very engaged teachers but most importantly the lifelong friendships I made.

History and Classical Studies: I enjoyed the political history from the Civil War era and some of the timeless satirical and romantic stories from Roman times in particular.

# Focus on... Art

Encouraging an interest in art starts early at Gateways with Early Years pupils using a wide range of creative materials to explore and express themselves. Art skills are developed further in Prep school, with specific art and DT lessons timetabled from Year 1.





The Gateways art department prides itself on offering a dynamic and creative curriculum. In High School by utilising all the talents of the staff, we are able to explore a wide range of subjects at GCSE and A Level; Art Craft and Design, Photography, and Textiles. This breadth and variety of art endorsements helps to ensure that all pupils can access a creative curriculum and latent ability is not left undiscovered. The introduction of DT by Mrs Hazelden has also opened up so many exciting links with art, with 3D design recently being added as an additional endorsement for A Level

Extra-curricular sessions are fundamental to our success and we offer a very popular Life Drawing club for Sixth Form pupils and parents. Lower 5 and Upper 5 pupils also enjoy

attending sessions to develop their art portfolios and practice. Recently, and as a direct effect of lockdown learning, we introduced a digital art club. Digital art is becoming increasingly popular, in particular the versatility of the iPad and the app 'Procreate'. This is such a creative and dynamic app which enables pupils to create complex illustrations and takes away the fear of failure as pupils feel confident to experiment and take risks



Gateways prides itself on 'making students think and act like artists' so instead of opting for very prescriptive projects at KS4/5 we allow our pupils a little autonomy to explore themes of their choosing. This ensures that work is both individual and meaningful to each pupil, giving them a much greater creative freedom and experience in the process. Work is showcased via the annual art exhibition which takes place in the summer term.

Prior to Covid, we offered art focused trips, notably the annual London galleries visit. This coincides with the graduate degree shows from the top London colleges and offers a great platform of ideas for students to develop their personal investigations in the autumn term. Our last cross curricular visit was to the magnificent city of Rome in October 2019, where we took in the beauty and splendor of Ancient Rome from the architecture, notably the Vatican City and St Peter's Basilica, to the phenomenal painting and sculptures across this ancient city. We are very much hoping that these art visits will resume in the next academic year.

Finally, we need to mention how fortunate we are with our talented and committed pupils and staff. Our work has been described by external moderators as 'a visual extravaganza' 'dynamic and varied in outcome and ideas.'



#### **NEW - GIFTED AND TALENTED** SPORT PROGRAMME


OUR PE DEPARTMENT ARE INTRODUCING A SPORTING GIFTED AND TALENTED PROGRAMME WITHIN HIGH SCHOOL FROM SEPTEMBER 2021. THE AIM IS TO PROVIDE OUR PUPILS WITH THE TIME NEEDED TO IMPROVE THEIR FITNESS AND GAIN AN UNDERSTANDING OF WHAT IS REQUIRED OF THEM AS AN ATHLETE.

The pupils will follow a planned programme and it is hoped that this will help complement their existing ability. Pupils will have the opportunity to learn how to plan their time effectively, understand how to be a role model and acquire knowledge of how to deal with different mental states alongside many other learning opportunities.

This is a programme in addition to the sports scholarship we offer. We will expect our scholars to be part of the programme but it will give more pupils the chance to be recognised at school for their ability in sport.

We have identified pupils in school who represent the school teams and teams/clubs outside of school. These pupils will be invited to a screening day in September where they can prove their fitness ability, games knowledge and tactical play as well as producing a portfolio of evidence to support their sporting ability. From this screening day we will then select our first group of Gifted and Talented pupils.
