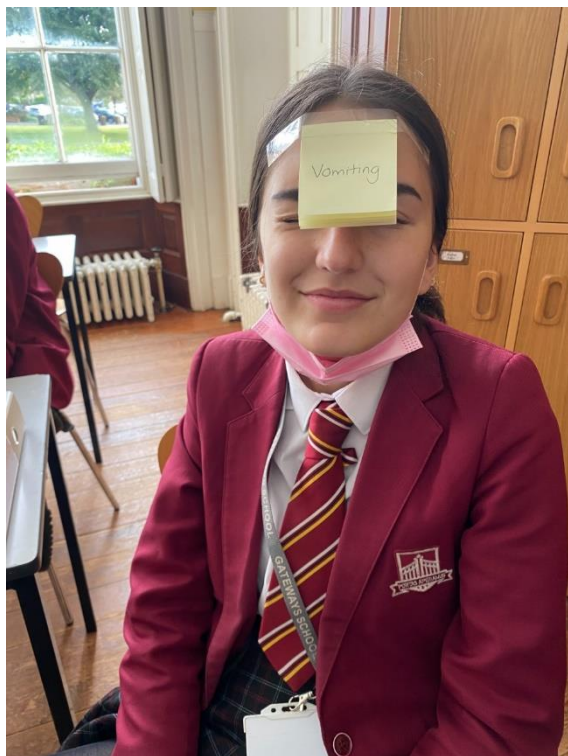


Who Am I? Upper 5 historians revise medicine in the Middle Ages



The Upper 5 historians have been studying 'Britain, health and the people' c.1000 onwards. People in the Middle Ages believed that illness was largely caused by the supernatural, but they also believed in the Ancient Greek theory of the four humours: that if one of your 'humours' (black bile, yellow bile, blood or phlegm) was out of balance, you would be ill. Upper 5 cheerfully sat with key words such as 'vomiting' and 'leeches' on their foreheads, whilst they tried to guess the word.
