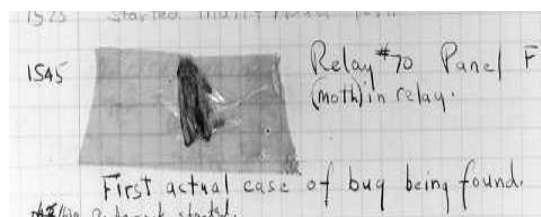


High School & Sixth Form
