Born in 1863, Konstantin Stanislavski was a Russian actor, director and theatre practitioner. Stanislavski Technique stems from his theatre practice and is still used by actors all around the world today.

Method acting is an actor training system made up of various techniques designed to allow actors to create believable characters and help them to really put themselves in the place of a character. Upper 3 will be learning about *Emotional Memory*, *Given Circumstances* and the *Magic If*.
