

Lower 5 historians work collaboratively on exam-style questions



The Lower 5 historians are currently studying the topic Britain: Health and the People c1000 – today. One of the key strands we have to consider is the relative significance of people, events and institutions. In this lesson the pupils were working in groups to consider the significance of three key Renaissance individuals, Andreas Vesalius, Ambroise Pare and William Harvey. They planned two 'P.E.E' paragraphs, focusing on short and long-term impacts and then presented their findings to the whole class.
