# Facilities developments

The majority of refurbishment work and facilities updates take place during the school holidays. The following updates took place during the summer holiday and October half term...

### LODGE RENOVATION

Complete renovation of the Lodge to provide an additional building for Sixth Form and Key Stage 4 (Lower 5 and Upper 5). The Lodge has 3 classrooms, a collaboration room (with lockers) and a study

room (with 6 study booths), as well as luxury toilet facilities. The interior has been designed and refurbished to the same high specification as the Old Vicarage (Sixth Form Centre).



## FACILITIES REFURBISHMENT

Toilet / washrooms totally refurbished in the Dower House, the PAC and Youngers (Prep) and the Sports Hall. The Sports Hall entrance was also refurbished and an



was also refurbished and extension was fitted to the girls changing rooms.

### OLD VICARAGE EXTENSION

This was undertaken during the summer to create two new rooms - an extra study booth room and a locker room.



### **OTHER FACILITIES UPDATES INCLUDE:**

New waste disposal company recruited who operate in a climate friendly and carbon neutral manner; updated fire alarm system in Schofield (High School), the Performing Arts Centre (PAC) and Sports Hall; new projector and screen (purchased by the PFA) installed in the PAC and a replacement red door for the Dower House.



## Former pupil Sherri Hyer attended Gateways from 2001 to 2012 and studied A Level Psychology, Religious Studies and English Language.

After Gateways, Sherri studied psychology at York University achieving a 2:1. Keen to pursue a career in teaching, Sherri returned to Gateways in 2015 to work as a Learning Support Assistant in both the Prep and High School before starting her PGCE in Harrogate.

#### What did you enjoy most about going to Gateways?

Having loved having Mrs Hayward as my geography teacher for five years, I knew I would really enjoy being taught psychology by her. Mrs Hayward is an incredible teacher with a caring approach and always made lessons fun with creative, educational and inspiring games which made us forget we were 'learning'. These ranged from CSI (which Mrs Hayward designed especially for my birthday) to Cluedo and Jungle Trails. I enjoyed psychology so much that I went onto study it further at degree level.

#### Did you take part in any extra-curricular activities?

Throughout my time at Gateways, I involved myself in many of the different clubs. I was an avid member of Amnesty International from Upper 3 through to Sixth Form. I took part in the debating club and was on the school council for quite a few years and took part in numerous house activities.

#### **TRIPS AND VISITS**

Here's a summary of some of the trips and visits which have taken place this term:



#### Willersley Castle

At the start of the term Upper 3 went on a three-day residential to Willersley Castle in the heart of the Derbyshire Dales. This outdoor centre was the perfect opportunity for friendship-building activities which included a scavenger hunt, grass sledging, kayaking and canoeing, aeroball, zip wire, river swimming, and even indoor fencing. Despite the very wet weather, the pupils had a fun-packed few days and it was great start to High School.



#### Combined Cadet Force (CCF) Sjt A Berry

Cadets have actively participated in a range of engaging activities this term, such as laser shotgun, BB, and paintball shooting, utilising the CCF's new state-of-theart equipment.

A select group of cadets had the extraordinary privilege of attending the 160 Welsh Brigade summer camp. This immersive week-long fieldcraft camp allowed them to refine their skills and knowledge, culminating in a thrilling simulated hostage rescue mission, where they utilized cutting-edge night vision goggles and paintball weapon systems.





#### **Otley Science Show**

In November, the Prep children from Key Stages 1 and 2 visited the Otley science show. Each year focuses on a different theme; this year for KS1 the topic was 'Amazing air' and for KS2 the theme was 'Ghosts in the machines' which looked at investigating the science around paranormal activity. The CCF cadets demonstrated their exceptional abilities by securing an impressive second place in a regional competition, earning them the coveted silver trophy.

Seven of our senior cadets attended a Senior Cadet Instructors Course (SCIC), where they all passed; this means they are now able to instruct and pass on their invaluable experience and knowledge to junior cadets.



#### DofE Mr A Berry, DofE Co-ordinator

During the first term back at school, the Duke of Edinburgh (DofE) participants have been actively involved in a range of activities with 30 pupils joining the bronze award level and 12 pupils successfully progressing to the silver award level. The new DofE pupils participated in their first training session, laying the foundation for their upcoming expedition training.





November saw the eagerly anticipated High School production of Legally Blonde JR which was a huge success. Crowd-pleasing numbers including 'Ohmigod You Guys' and 'Legally Blonde' were skilfully performed. Lucy Sherman totally embodied the part of Elle Woods. Well done to all pupils involved in the show.

## Focus on... Growth

At Gateways, we have three core pillars -Growth, Wellbeing and Success. In this issue we are focusing on 'Growth'.

The growth pillar covers one's own knowledge, skills and confidence as well as being able to support others to develop their own knowledge, skills and confidence.

One of the key areas that staff have been working on recently relates to curriculum development. ## Prep School and Early Years

Our offerings in the Prep School have grown over the previous 12 months, with a lot of new initiatives, events and extracurricular clubs taking place throughout the academic year.

Prep School **'Open Doors'** and **'Pop into Pre-Reception'** events have welcomed parents into the classrooms to celebrate the academic successes of their children and to see life 'behind the scenes' in Gateways Prep School. These have been hugely successful events, where children have enjoyed showing off to their parents about all they have done in school and have helped to further embed our close teacher/parent relationships.





Calendar events such as our 'Celebrating Differences Day,' 'Odd Socks Day' and 'International Day' have all added to the children's knowledge and appreciation of other cultures, faiths and circumstances, allowing them to grow as individuals.

It is important at Gateways that the children understand how fortunate we are and to have empathy with those in different circumstances to ourselves. These new additions to our calendar help us achieve this objective.

## High School and Sixth Form

## In High School, opportunities for personal growth are supported by the enrichment programme for our Sixth Form.

Lower 6 pupils enjoy exploring titles for their extended project qualification (EPQ). The work, which can take the form of an artefact, research based written report, event or experiment offers pupils academic growth beyond their core A Level programme. Universities are always keen to hear from candidates who complete an EPQ as the process develops planning and research skills in addition to skills in analysis and reflection.



Our school prefects always take a lead in organising assemblies and initiatives on themes such as equality and diversity, black history month and school charities. They work closely with academic staff and provide crucial food for thought to our Upper 5 pupils, ahead of them making important decisions as part of the Sixth Form transition process.

Careers advice and support is offered throughout High School, this is adapted to the year group. Lower 6 and Upper 5 recently visited the University and Apprenticeship Search Fair, supporting them to reach well-informed, reflective and independent decisions about their next steps within education or the world of work.



Pupils across High School and Sixth Form have enjoyed a growth in facilities; as well as the opening of the new Sixth Form Centre in September 2022, this September we opened the Lodge. Situated close to the dining hall, the newly refurbished building offers areas for independent study, small group work and options teaching.
