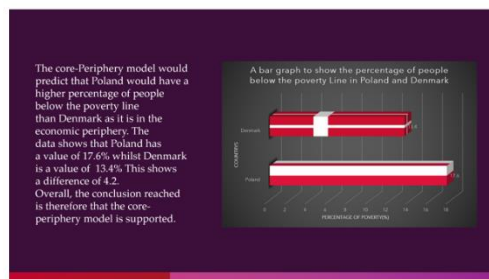


Upper 4 present research on the European core-periphery model



HOW DENMARK HAS BENEFITTED FROM THE EU

- During the next 7 years, the new common agriculture policy is going to invest more than EUR 7 billion in Danish farming sector and rural areas. Key political priorities have been defined at European level such as: jobs, sustainability, modernisation, innovation and quality.
- The European Regional Development Fund gave Denmark €120 million which will help Denmark to promote a more inclusive labour market and a skilled workforce.



Having covered the countries and capitals of Europe, Upper 4 have recently been exploring the contrasts that exist within the continent.

To do this, pupils have spent their last few lessons undergoing research to test out the theory of the core-periphery model by comparing different countries.

Pupils had to locate their countries geographically, access data for each country, generate graphs of the data and then analyse these to reach conclusions about whether the theory was supported or refuted.

The final stage was a presentation to the rest of the class summarising their findings, which was a superb opportunity to develop some of the soft skills that employers look for.

Public speaking can be a challenging skill, so it was impressive to hear the confidence of our Upper 4s who appear well prepared for the future!
