The step up in age for KS2 saw a step up in content. We had a discus competition, tennis ball throws moved up to a turbo javelin and then, for the Lower 3 group, a full javelin. Distance running moved to 400m, then 600m for Upper 2 and 800m at the higher age group. Long jump was measured to the centimetre rather than awarding points. The children had prepared so hard for this across the past term and a half and they lapped up the opportunity to compete and test their technique.

There were so many stand out moments but, undoubtedly, the performance of the day saw Lily in Lower 3 clear over 4 metres in the long jump, a stunning feat, particularly when considering that this was further than any girl in High School had achieved.

The final event was the Upper 2 and Lower 3 relays with Beningbrough and then Newby winning their respective races.
