The first game against Terrington saw us fall to defeat despite often playing smarter cricket. With the bat we were consistent in striking the ball if it was on middle or off stump but need more experience in taking advantage of anything down leg side. Sadie led by example with our first boundaries, her cricketing experience making light of anything on the leg side, with a glorious 6 over midwicket. We were a little more reserved, as a team, from that point but still set a decent target. This pattern remained in our second game, this time against Barnard Castle, who had a team full of club players who regularly experienced the hardball, full pads and helmets, style of cricket. This was the big difference between the two teams.



Terrington and Barney both chased down and surpassed our totals. This despite some exceptional bowling from all our girls; Ruby learning the hard way that softball cricket punishes consistent bowling as the ball sits up for the batters to have a swipe at.
