Theo was the pick of the bowlers with figures of 2 overs, 3 wickets for 5 runs. Yet Highfield enjoyed the chance to hit the better balls and pushed their total to 262 with one over remaining. Thankfully Sammy stayed calm and, with 5 dot balls and one boundary, the game ended in a 266 run tie.
