During the afternoon pupils had the opportunity to practice essential transferrable skills, such as listening, teamworking, communicating in different ways, and developing information and digital literacy skills by using good-quality and trusted careers websites. Journalists and researchers got to work investigating this career option and creating a range of interesting questions.
