REFRESH OF EARLY YEARS

New spaces and areas created to entice exploration and maximise learning opportunities. New fittings and furnishings also added.



A NEW STRENGTH AND CONDITIONING GYM IN HIGH SCHOOL

The creation of this fantastic facility has been supported by the generous fundraising of the Gateways PFA. Located next to the Sports Hall, the gym is well-equipped with weights racks, a rowing machine, ski machine and air bike and provides an excellent space for pupils and staff to focus on fitness, wellbeing and athletic development. It's regularly used by High School pupils during PE and Games lessons and Sixth Form students during their Wednesday enrichment sessions. There are also several before school, after school, and lunchtime sessions. Prep pupils also get the opportunity to use it as part of their PE programme.

Enrichment Programme

Spotlight on... Flying Club

Gateways Flying Club is an exciting enrichment opportunity for pupils with a passion for aviation. Through a mix of practical workshops, flight simulator sessions and the possibility to book flights at a local airfield, pupils explore the principles of flight, aircraft design and factors that affect flight like the weather. With expert input from Mr Thompson, this club is perfect for anyone curious about the skies – from future pilots to aviation enthusiasts.

The club is open to pupils from Lower 3 to Upper 6. There are 3 sessions after school with a maximum of 12 pupils in each. The Wings syllabus is the introductory group and once pupils have successfully completed this level they can progress onto further advanced levels (Level 1 through to Level 4).



Meet... Mr Thompson



Mr Thompson has been the Flying Club instructor at Gateways since April 2025. He recently joined Gateways in a new role as School Staff Instructor within the CCF, helping Capt Davies with planning and managing exercises, alongside weekly cadet training for cadets from Gateways and Horsforth School.

What was your previous job before you joined Gateways?

My last full-time job was in the Royal Air Force as a Flight Operation Officer, completing over 31 years of service. I retired from the RAF in 2019, then spent my time being a house husband looking after my 3 boys.

What are you looking forward to about Gateways?

I'm really looking forward to working with the friendly close-knit community of students and staff. Having already had the privilege of working with some of the students in my role as Gateways Flying Club Instructor has been great.

What was your favourite subject when you were at school and why?

I enjoyed the sciences, especially finding out how things worked and also found art a way to express my creativity, but mostly I really got stuck into sports, especially rugby.

TRIPS AND VISITS

Here's a summary of some of the trips and visits which have taken place this term:

Upper 3 residential

At the start of the term, Upper 3 enjoyed their first High School residential to PGL Newby Wiske. They took part in lots of activities designed to encourage teamwork and communication including aeroball, Jacob's ladder, climbing, problem solving, fencing, archery and abseiling.

THE OLD VICARAGE – a Sixth Form experience like no other

Our £1.7 million flagship development, The Old Vicarage, has the feel of a boutique university campus and offers a blend of independence and support. Students enjoy a variety of study and social spaces including collaborative garden pods, private study booths, a lounge, small classrooms, a dedicated gym featuring Peloton bikes and a stylish bistro, all designed to encourage academic focus and personal wellbeing.

Why it matters: Many schools offer dedicated Sixth Form facilities, but few provide the level of sophistication and independence found at Gateways. We have set a new benchmark for preparing students for life beyond school.

LUXURY CHANGING FACILITIES and toilet upgrades

Wellbeing isn't just about classrooms, it extends to every corner of school life; in the summer of 2024, we invested over £75,000 to completely transform our changing facilities in the Sports Hall, creating spaces that now feel more like a premium health club than a school. Floor-to-ceiling toilet and shower cubicles guarantee complete privacy, while high-end fixtures and finishes deliver comfort and style.

This project marked the start of a wider programme to upgrade all toilet facilities across the school, ensuring everyone experiences the same level of quality and care.

THE LODGE – focused learning in style

From derelict to dazzling, the transformation of The Lodge is a testament to our commitment to excellence. This £400,000

refurbishment created bespoke classrooms for small-group learning, individual study booths and collaborative spaces, all finished to the same high standard as The Old Vicarage. GCSE and Sixth Form students benefit from an environment that feels calm, focused and aspirational.

Why it matters: Provision of additional high quality learning spaces for collaborative working and individual study.



In addition, the PFA have raised funds which have contributed to several school projects over the years. The most recent larger PFA funded projects are the design and installation of a new Prep outdoor play area and the creation of a strength and conditioning gym in High School.

FUTURE VISION £5 million Prep School development

Planning has been secured for a multi-million pound Prep School extension, designed to deliver state-of-the-art learning spaces for pupils from Pre-Reception to Upper 1. Spaces vacated by Early Years in the Littlegates building will become a cutting-edge area for technology in the High School, housing art, design technology, photography, textiles, food technology and computing.
